OFFICIAL LETTER OF REPRIMAND

RE: MREC v. Lindsey Richard; case no. 106-2106

Greetings:

The Mississippi Real Estate Commission concluded its investigation in the matter of the above referenced case and the Informal Resolution that you signed was presented to and approved by the Commission.

The Real Estate Commission determined that the information obtained during the investigation of your criminal history was sufficient to show that you were in violation of Rule 5.1 (B) of the Mississippi Real Estate Commission Rules and Regulations when you failed to notify the Commission of your October, 2020 DUI conviction within 10 days.

Rule 3.1 General Rules

F. Any licensee who fails in a timely manner to respond to official Mississippi Real Estate Commission written communication or who fails or neglects to abide by Mississippi Real Estate Commission's Rules and Regulations shall be deemed, prima facie, to be guilty of improper dealing.

Rule 5.1 (B) states:

B. Every licensee shall, within ten days, notify the Real Estate Commission of any adverse court decisions in which the licensee appeared as a defendant.

This Official Letter of Reprimand will be placed in your file to become a part of your permanent record. You should take every precaution to familiarize yourself with the Real Estate Brokers License Act of 1954, as Amended, and the Administrative Rules and Regulations of the Real Estate Commission in order to avoid a serious violation which might affect the status of your license.
